## Here are a few important tips to help you prepare:

Follow the directions below, and Just Say No to Box Canyon Rd...Google maps and other technologies are not accurate out here and will send you on a shortcut (especially coming from the north) that is Not a viable road. DO NOT USE A GPS navigation system. Google maps etc. are Not reliable out here. Call our steward Bob Jeffers' cell: 509-250-0171 from the road if you need anything.

We are located about 2.5 hours from Portland and about 4 hours from Seattle. From Goldendale, WA, the nearest town, it takes about 30 minutes of travel time. We request that you send us a text as you are heading through Goldendale so that we have a "real-time ETA" for you and can be on hand to greet you when you arrive.

Bring good walking shoes, layers, a hat, and some water. The walk out to White Eagle is about 2 miles round trip on a road of uneven ground. If you cannot walk out, or choose not to, we'll use our ranch truck. If you use a wheel chair, the ground around the lodge is mostly flat.

## **DRIVING DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Follow Highway 97 South from Yakima, or Highway 97 North from the Columbia River.
- 2. From Highway 97, take the Broadway Street exit (also Highway 142) at the 76 Service Station.
- 3. Go one block, then turn left at Aimee's Attic onto Bickleton Road.
- 4. Continue east for 10 miles (watch for milepost marker 10) and turn left onto Old Mountain Road.
- 5. In approximately 1 mile, the pavement curves down and to the right and crosses at Badger Gulch–follow it across the small bridge to stay on Old Mountain Road.
- 6. About 3 miles later, the pavement ends. Slow down to 25 mph or less. Save our roads and neighborly relations, and reduce dust and wear and tear on your car.
- 7. In about another mile, look for the blue 455 house marker on the left and the **Ekone Ranch sign** on the right. Turn right onto Ekone Road. Slow down more to 10 mph or less. You'll pass our closest neighbors and head down Ekone Road for almost 1 mile, until it dips left and brings you down into Ekone Ranch Valley.
- 8. A steward will meet you by the large octagonal Lodge building, and direct you where to park.
- 9. The WEMP gate is another mile out the road to the canyon, on the far side of the Ekone ranch Valley. We'll caravan out there together.
